(lamps accepted through March 30, 2012)

**For City Residential, Commercial, Industrial & Non-Profit
Property Owners & Tenants**

(property address must be presented with lamps)

- Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources recommends fluorescent lamp recycling
- Fluorescent lamps contain mercury, which is a hazardous substance requiring proper disposal
- Lamp materials, including glass, mercury, phosphor powder and aluminum are recyclable

**Recycle unbroken fluorescent, incandescent & specialty lamps at:
City Clerk's Office
City Hall, 30 East Eau Claire Street, Rice Lake WI
Monday-Friday 8 a.m. – 4:00 p.m.**

Residential entities - drop off lamps to be packaged by City staff.

Commercial, industrial & non-profit entities – drop off lamp storage boxes sealed and labeled with entity's name/address (storage boxes available for purchase at the City Clerk's Office or use your own boxes).

All lamps will be shipped to a State-approved vendor for proper processing.
